So, the 40th, 45th and then came the 50th where we took on a change in members as some dropped out and new ideas came in. When we started planning the 50th, the main objective was to make the class reunion affordable to any and all that would like to attend. For those that were at the 50th and attended the Meet & Greet and the Saturday Night 3-meat Banquet, all for \$35 you were impressed, at least from all the kudos that were sent our way and we very much appreciated them all.

We have classmates, who wish to remain anonymous but joined right in and helped with their support and opened up their heart and their checkbook and donated, that's when we started asking folks to help out and yes, a \$5 or \$10 donation really adds up and you will see that as you read on.

Make note that just because we are releasing the individual cost to attend, does not mean we are not accepting donations for the 55th event anymore. Our announcement of the cost is really predicated on some of the classmates that said they would donate, but have yet to forward with said donation our way. So, we're counting on that.

For those that promised they would help with the cause, and for those that would just want to chip in a mill or two, we've made it pretty simple to do. Okay, here is the proposed cost for attending the 55th class reunion. Each person coming to the Saturday night 3-meat banquet will pay **\$20** and that will include the Meet & Greet on Friday. If you plan on attending only the Meet & Greet, the cost will be **\$10** per person.

Like the 50th, the Meet & Greet from 2:00 p.m. until 6:00 p.m. will consist of ongoing Hors D' Oeuvres of Pot Stickers, Meatballs, Mini Beef Wellingtons, Chicken Strips, Fried Ravioli and the Route 66 Teaser. There will also be a cash bar. "Dilly-Dilly"

The Saturday night event will kick off with a reception at 6:00 p.m. and then at 7:00 we will start the banquet and that will last until Larry Don & Olé Friends run out of gas and the meal will consist of Prime Rib, Apricot Chicken Breast with Brandy Cream Sauce and Baked Lemon Pepper Cod, being served with Flame Roasted Potatoes, Cajun Corn (Maque Chouz) and a mixed green salad with ranch or Italian dressings, all with assorted desserts, dinner rolls, coffee, tea & water. There will also be a cash bar set up. Tell me where you can go, other than the 55th reunion and get all that, plus a live band for \$20 bucks?

Now for the sleeping quarters. To book a room at the Holiday Inn, located at 3402 Arizona Ave., phone 417-624-9000 and give the code **Joplin Class of '64** you may book a room for \$99. Each room has a microwave and refrigerator. If you care to have a breakfast in the Route 66 diner each morning, the room cost with be \$109. So state which you prefer when registering.

The owners of the Holiday Inn also own the Comfort Inn and the Quality Inn and all three are right there together, creating a hotel campus so to speak and we've been offered rates at these two also. The Comfort Inn 417-627-0400 will have a rate of \$85 and the Quality Inn 417-627-0440 will have a rate of \$65 and the price will include your breakfast at both hotels. They are within walking distance (about a block) from the Holiday Inn parking lot. **"Badda Book—Badda Boom"** 

Here is where those traveling to Joplin and staying at the Holiday Inn can help us out as well as the Holiday Inn. Could you please let us know that you have intentions on staying at the Holiday Inn? I have been asked by Kristy Barley, how many rooms should they reserve for us and in looking at the tentative attendance we have 35 out of the 76 classmates signed up to attend, that live out of town. I know some have other preference in hotels using travel & air miles and others still have relatives in the area and will stay with them. But for those staying at the Holiday Inn I would love to turn a head count in so Kristy can start blocking rooms for that weekend in June. We do not want to short change anyone that may want to stay there, so it's better to get our names on the list now. To sum this all up, if you have intentions on attending the June 7th-9th reunion and you have not yet given us your official okie dokie, please do so by sending us an email to the class email <u>jop-linmo64@joplinmo64.com</u> and we will add you to the attendee list. We have started finalizing our plans as 8 months ain't all that far away folks.

At this moment in time, we have 134 people signed to attend the 55th reunion. Out of that 76 are classmates. Our only adversary is the size of the banquet room at the Holiday Inn, with the round seating of 8 to a table, the room holds 21 tables, minus 3 tables for band riser and dance floor takes us to around 152 people, so we're 20 or so away from our maximum using the round tables. If we go to all cafeteria type tables we can get to around 175 people. So, if you have the slightest inkling that you will be attending, it would be best to get your name on the attendee list **NOW**. We have to have Holiday Inn PAID IN FULL two weeks prior to our event, which makes our financial obligation to them May 24th. So the importance of getting ones name on the list and paying in a timely manner, is ever so important. Give it a quick think over and know that it is going to be one fine gathering and a great two or three days.

What all will the travelers that will be arriving on Thursday do as they stay in the old hometown and what all comes with the \$20 fee?

As we've already mentioned, the Meet & Greet on Friday afternoon and the Banquet Saturday evening, featuring a live band, headlining our own classmate Larry Don Williams and Olé Friends, which will be just one highlight of our reunion. We will also have back Dick & Dot Espy, videotaping and photo shooting for some everlasting memories. Yes, a **FREE DVD** will be presented to all in attendance, and that will be mailed at a later date... Also, photos will be available on the class website for downloading and printing at your convenience. Again, as in the past, a FREE class directory will be available to those attending the reunion, and that is why it's ever so important to make sure you have given us your up to date contact information. All our functions, except for the golf outing will be held at the Holiday Inn. The Meet & Greet will kick off at 2:00 p.m. and will be held in the banquet room and also some setups will be in the hall-way adjoining said room. Dress code is super casual, meaning shorts and cool type shirt or top. A virtual jukebox is offered for us to use and pick out favorite songs and is furnished by Mike Knisley, the class of '65. We will also have several '65 classmates who volunteered to work our event. They will free up our classmates who at the 50th were tired to the registration and raffle tables, so this way, all classmates may mingle and chit-chat as they munch and sip their beverage of choice. Thank you, class of '65, very much appreciated. There will also be decorations that will offer still photo possibilities, so smile big.

Saturday morning will be tee-off time at Schifferdecker & will be announced at the start of 2019. Captain Jim Christiansen said that the Pro and his staff set reserved schedules in January, so we will get back with you on that and what amenities will be available. We do know that this time we will offer several prizes. The prizes and or monetary awards will consist of a payout and will be for the longest putt, closest to the pin, longest drive, lowest score and a hole in one. The payout will consist of men playing against the men and women against women in the same categories.

On Saturday night, a reception will start at 6:00 p.m. as we gather in the hallway and banquet room and dress code should be a very comfy type casual. We will ask all to be seated at 7:00 p.m. and have a few announcements and then we will begin to break bread as we mosey toward the buffet bar. After we chow down, we will do the raffle, hand out the golf awards and offer anyone in attendance a chance at the mic to say anything they care to comment on about the event or any class functions. So, preplan your thoughts, we'd love to hear them.

We take pride in working to try to make each event run smooth and make it easy for each classmate to be on board and be a part of the event. So, with a cost of \$20 per person we need to stress the importance of signing up and paying your \$20 bucks.

We have mentioned on previous pages about donating to the reunion to keep our attendance cost as low as possible, which will allow many more to attend, some have yet to attend a reunion or they haven't since the 25th. Whatever the reason, we as a reunion committee would wish that if you have doubts about attending, that you give strong consideration in making the 55th one where you joined us to see what a small committee has taken the time to keep the connection alive and well for just a couple of days. We've had class reunions since we were 5 years out from graduating and with the up and coming 55th, this is the celebration of the 50th reunion.



Now, let us talk about registering to attend. We've asked for support donations for the 55th reunion and that can be done through the class GoFundMe site or mailing a check to Stephanie White Everitt at **2821 Wisconsin**, **Joplin**, **MO 64804**. **Registering to attend the 55th should only be done by mailing a check or money order to Stephanie**, and printing the name/names attending. GoFundMe takes a small percentage of the funding donations and by sending registration fee to Steph, we will have complete names of attendees as well as the entire \$20, which is what we need to keep our event, one of memories and friends that we share as classmates being together, at least until 2024.

We make it a point while planning the reunion not to dwell on the classmates that have gone on ahead of us as it's our intentions to keep the reunion as jovial as possible. However, I did ask the committee members a couple of meetings ago this question. "How many classmates have passed since the 50th reunion, which was less than four years ago?" I had guesses from seven to eighteen and the answer is thirty-three. We get asked at times about how many classmates have we lost total and that is 120. We have 25 classmates unaccounted for and some of those may have passed on, we do have one that we were told had passed, but we're having a difficult time verifying that information.
